FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, author of the Sherlock Holmes stories, wrote, "It is a capital mistake to theorize before one has data." Relevant data should drive all decisions that lead to changes in our courses, programs, offices, and departments.

As you gather data, you will notice findings, and you will make recommendations. **Findings** consist of what the data says. For example, the recent Student Advisor Evaluation revealed that 80% of the student body met with their academic advisor during the Fall 2018 semester. This data could be represented visually on a pie chart showing that 80% of the student body met with their advisors, and 20% did not meet with their advisors (see bottom right). From that statistic, we gather that most students recognize the need for input from their academic advisors.

Recommendations are explicit, action-oriented goals spurred by the findings. These goals should be SMART: Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Timely. Using data from the Student Advisor Evaluation, we could set the following SMART goal: "Through email reminders and registration incentives, we will increase the number of students who meet with their advisors by 5% during the spring semester so that students will be prepared for the summer semester and the fall semester." This goal includes all five SMART components:

Specific: "we will increase the number of students who meet with their advisors"

Measurable: "by 5%"

Achievable: "through email reminders and registration incentives"

Relevant: "so that students will be prepared for the summer

semester and the fall semester"

Timely: "during the spring semester"

If we ignore data as the foundation of decision-making and goalsetting, we may, in the words of Doyle, "twist facts to suit theories, instead of theories to suit facts."


